

Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

Preamble

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 (1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps we have taken to reduce the possibility of slavery and human trafficking occurring anywhere in our company as well as in our supply chains during the financial year ending 30/6-2017.

Our business

CPI is part of the BORG Automotive Group (BA) which is one of Europe's largest independent remanufacturing companies. With 40 years of experience in remanufacturing automotive parts, BA are specialists in sales, production and distribution of starters, alternators, brake calipers, EGR-valves, AC-compressors, steering racks, steering pumps and columns in the automotive aftermarket.

BA has its global headquarter in Silkeborg, Denmark. The company has subsidiaries in Belgium, Poland and UK, employs around 1.400 people and has a turnover of around 70 million GBP.


Our supply chains

BA purchases parts/materials for its products from various suppliers located mainly in China. During the financial year 2016/2017 we have modified our Code of Conduct (CoC), which BA suppliers outside Europe must sign to fulfil our expectations and is the supplier's obligation with respect to human trafficking and modern slavery. We will request our suppliers to cascade this through their own supply chain where appropriate. The updated CoC clearly states that BA will not tolerate forced labour, child labour, human trafficking, physical abuse or anything similar to modern slavery within our supply chain. We require suppliers to certify compliance with the above requirements and will consider terminating our relationship with a supplier if issues of none compliance with the above conditions are not addressed in a timely manner.

In order to monitor and mitigate the risks of slavery and human trafficking occurring within our supply chains we will seek to continually review and visit the operations of existing suppliers in relation to the risk of modern slavery or human trafficking.

This policy statement will be reviewed annually and published on CPI's homepage.
